News from Diverse Cymru



Diverse Cymru works across Wales to promote Equality for all – specialising in advocacy and BME Mental Health, and our BME Mental Health Digital Support Project has been going from strength to strength during the last year.

Funded by Welsh Government, our staff have been working closely with communities to tackle feelings of isolation and loneliness during the pandemic. Taking a digitally competent approach has meant that more people from across Wales have felt able to join in with the services we provide, and we have been more able to facilitate drop-in sessions that would otherwise be very time-intensive when conducted face to face, allowing us to engage with clients in numbers we wouldn't have been able to manage before the pandemic. Balancing this with in-person support has led to a more holistic service for our community to benefit from.
